Dear Friends of Life...



What a whirlwind these last two weeks have been! It started with our Thursday evening banquet and Alisha sharing "God's story" and how He has worked in her life. There were lots of emotions amongst the crowd; even men were shedding tears. The result of both fundraising banquets saw the Lord bring in \$203,000 in financial gifts plus commitments to pay off a 3-D ultrasound that we've been trying to purchase

for a year now. Thank you, Lord. "For every good and perfect gift comes from above." (James 1:17a)

Now we're hearing that Roe vs Wade may be overturned. According to Metro News of May 3, 2022, "if a U.S. Supreme Court majority reverses the historic Roe vs. Wade decision as a leaked opinion suggests, West Virginia already has a law that would outlaw abortion. West Virginia voters have also approved a state constitutional amendment to specify that "Nothing in this Constitution secures or protects a right to abortion or requires the funding of abortion."

Those two aspects of law place West Virginia among the states most likely to ban abortion if the anticipated Supreme Court ruling leaves the matter to states, according to The Guttmacher Institute, a research organization focused on advancing reproductive health policy. West Virginia Attorney General Patrick Morrisey said the tentative nature of the draft document that was leaked means it's too soon to say how the state's abortion policies would be affected."

How would that affect Women's Care Center? It's too soon to speculate, but some of us will attend a WV Pregnancy Coalition meeting next week to learn more about this possibility. We want to be ready to serve even more women who find themselves in an unplanned pregnancy. We'll keep you posted.

To top off the end of these couple of weeks, a task force will begin meeting this Friday focusing on our need to test and treat for more sexually transmitted infections. As we increase services, we can offer more women in the Mid-Ohio Valley area more comprehensive sexual health care.





For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.






























Baby Bottle Campaign 2022!
